

Visit Report of Indian Institute of Public Health, Gandhinagar

- The Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI) is a public private initiative that has collaboratively evolved through consultations with multiple constituencies including Indian and international academia, state and central governments, multi & bi-lateral agencies and civil society groups.
- The Prime Minister of India, Dr. Manmohan Singh, launched PHFI on March 28, 2006 at New Delhi. It is an autonomously governed public private initiative registered as a Society under the Societies Registration Act 1860.
- The creation of PHFI in 2006 was enabled by the Government of India and supported by multiple stakeholders. Initial funding support came from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW), the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, other foundations and private philanthropy.
- It runs at its own premises located at Chiloda, Gandhinagar.
- It is working collaboratively with range of stakeholders including the national and state governments, national and international academia, civil society, global foundations, individual leaders, and the private sector.
- Their activities include providing academic programmes, training, research and promotion of Health.
- Key projects of IIPH includes Strengthening Ecosystem for Sustainable and Inclusive Health Financing in India (SESSIHF), PRIDE- Transforming mental health for young people, SCCoPE - Strengthening Cessation Capacity of Primary Care Professionals, PIPPSE - The HIV/AIDS Partnership: Impact through Prevention, Private Sector and Evidence-based Programming, Immunization Technical Support Unit (ITSU), Swasthya Slate – Affordable Technologies, The Uttar Pradesh Community Mobilization Project.
