Observations

- Water Scarcity issue in this villages are very high ;
- <u>Population</u>: 250 Hhs in Rahtalav & 1300 Hhs in junisodhi villages;
- <u>Roof water tank :</u>
 - > Only 50 created in Rahtalav;
 - Both villages are demanding for this tank;
 - Wasmo has withdraw these scheme;
 - Estimated costing per water tank: Rs. 40,000/-;
- <u>Livelihood:</u>
 - ➢ Avg. Land holding: 3-5 vighas;
 - Rain fed cropping only ;(1 season);

- ➤ MGNREGA;
- Digging work at L & T;
- Migration : for Diamond work or labour work;

Animal Husbandry

- Reduced rate of milk due to low fat;
- Existing dairy : Uttam ;
- No food & water for animals;
- Health of Animals is very poor due to high price of grass and water scarcity;
- Villagers are losing their interest;
- Veterinary doctor is coming from Dhandhuka as per call;

Education:

- > Only one computer is working in Rahtalav ;
- Compute lab is not there;
- Lack of teachers in std. 9 & 10 in Juni sodhi villages;
- > Parents are demanding to start computer course for their children;

Rahtalav:

- Only 30% students are enrolled for secondary education;
- Most of the girls are not studying after the 8th standard;
- Junisodhi : Lack of teachers in standard 9 & 10;
- > After 12th Standard , most of the youths have not doing any work;

<u>Health:</u>

- Rahtalav: Aayush hospital , doctor is coming daily;
- Junisodhi: PHC is in functional;
- If there is major health issue: Either Dholera or Dhandhuka or Bhavnagar;
- ➤ 108 services is good;

Government Schemes:

Rathtalav has 100% job card for mgnerga schemes;

- Rate (1 brass digging : Rs. 200);
- ➢ 60% have enrolled in Ma-card;
- Ujawala yojna, Vidhva Sahay is not covered more;
- Pradhanmantri Awas Yojna :- Sarpanch is perparing the list and submit it to the government
- Most of the villagers have BPL card;

Suggested Projects:

- Roof water Harvesting :
 - All villagers have facing water scarcity issue they also demanding for this project;
 - They need tank to store the rain water;
 - WASMO has closed this scheme;
 - Community are ready to contribute 30% as in a labour work;
 - PIA, Villagers & Sarpanch has also planned to request WASMO to start this scheme;
 - If WASMO agree then we may carry out this project from the following financial budget:
 - Rs. 40,000/- per tank = Rs. 12,000/- beneficiary contribution + WASMO Contribution (50%i.e. Rs. 20,000/-)+ GCSRA Contribution (20 % i.e. Rs. 8,000/-)
 - Concept: SHG: Sanitary Napkin manufacturing + Selling + Govt. Scheme Linkages (Rs. 20) + Other Products (Soap, Powder etc.);
 - > Jignasha Project:
 - Electric Repairing Entrepreneurs: (Every Households has electric motor & Hand-pump);
 - > They are asking for computer training & sewing training;
